




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

- 2) conscience points humans toward that objective morality







# Conscience and Darwinism


- 1) Neo-Darwinism has focused more on the "how" of morality, some on "why"
- 2) It has raised considerable doubt on the objectivity of human ethics and morality



The Complex Brain is the Product of Evolution

The hardware of the brain evolved simultaneously with the software of the conscience that runs on it.

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


A person with a functioning conscience is the opposite of someone mentally ill. Once we understand how the brain works, we'll know how conscience works.

But our brain is quite different from our mechanical computers, possibly making use of quantum realities

#### Morality is a Survival Program

Those things which enable us to survive gets passed on. Therefore if we have morality, it is only a survival mechanism programmed into us by evolution. It is not "truth."



### The Complex Brain is the Product of Evolution

#### Atheism

Science and theology now agree that there is a nature and nurture component to morality.


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
