They told us more people would have come if they'd had more advance notice — which we promised to give next time!

Deaconess Emilie Prozenko and Ruth Stone continue to lead English classes on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Attendance is growing as they make connections in the Parc-Extension community. Both are also enrolled in French classes now. Plans are in place for a personal finance and "introduction to Canadian and Quebec taxes" open house in April.

As for me, I'm back to leading Sunday worship and Bible classes. I've also been leading mid-week Lenten services by Zoom. Our theme has been "The Five Temptations of Christ." I'll be preparing for Holy Week and Easter services in April, restarting our Wednesday Bible study, and beginning a junior confirmation class later in the month.

You may notice the "Montreal map" at the bottom of our newsletter instead of the usual map of the Caribbean. As I'm back only 75% time, I've been given leave to focus 100% on Montreal for a little bit. That's exactly what I've been doing, to the great appreciation of a congregation that has had a challenging and yet fruitful two years.


Mission Moment

Our two confirmands this month come from the same area of the world but from very different backgrounds. One is a student from Thailand who came from a Presbyterian tradition. She had a lot of questions about the formalities of the liturgy: "Do I need to cross myself? Do I need to bow at the altar?" We spoke a lot about the essentials of the faith: God's saving grace shown in Christ's crucifixion and given to her through the promises of His Word.

Our other confirmand was only baptized last year. She comes from India and is looking to make a new life for herself and her daugher in Canada. All of Christianity is new to her, so her questions are refreshing and remind us of the importance of "the main things."

She has mentioned to me the importance of being heard, especially for new people to our country. We hear the Lord speak his Word in our gatherings. But the work of the people – our liturgy – is also to listen to one another (Gal 6:2).

I'm challenged by the need to provide opportunities for intentional listening in our congregational life. As we exit from most of our pandemic restrictions, we'll be introducing new ways to do this.
