

Where There's Smoke, There's Fire

The forest fire season started in spectacular fashion in Quebec, with fires consuming more trees in a month than normally burn over an entire ten year period. The smoke from these fires has extended deep into the United States, blanketing major US cities from Chicago to New York.

The old saying says that where there's smoke, there's fire. The reverse is also often true: where there's fire, there's often smoke. The cleansing fire of the Holy Spirit brings the smoke of new Christian life into the world: a sweet smelling incense that brings the scent of Jesus.

This month we heard the confession of faith of two young men who have been studying the Scriptures and the Small Catechism with me for many months. We also had a baptism and heard the confirmation of Parisa, wife of our member Vahid, who felt the heat of the Spirit drawing her to Christ. Where the Word is being shared, the Spirit is at work. Where the fire of the Spirit is at work, we see the smoke of his presence.

We also concluded another term of English outreach classes, with several dozen students completing our beginners' English class and a couple dozen more completing our advanced English class. Kudos to Ruth Stone who led the teaching for both classes, and to Deaconess Emilie who assisted Ruth and me by keeping track of attendance and generating letters and certificates for all participants. Thanks, as well, to all our volunteers both near and far!

On Sunday, June 11, I was in St. Louis participating in the floor committee meetings for our upcoming Synod convention. It was my privilege to help draft resolutions dealing with the Church and Culture. Pastor Walta Clercius, a pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Haiti and also of the Lutheran Church — Canada, preached in French and then in English at Ascension before travelling on to Quebec City to preach there in the afternoon. The fire of the Spirit moved through the Word of Christ which he shared. We will be happy to welcome him back in late July.

Where there is smoke, there is fire. And where there is the Word of Christ, his salvation and life, there is the Holy Spirit.


Mission Moments
