Campus Ministry

Our main focus for campus ministry this year has been on the four college students who attend Ascension regularly. In addition to our own Olivia, we have a student from the LCC church in New Brunswick, another from a WELS church near Toronto, and a third from a Synod of France congregation in Paris. We took them all to Quebec City for a day at the (very soggy) winter carnival. It was the 70th anniversary of the festival and the temperature was above forty fahrenheit about twenty degrees higher than usual. Despite a melting ice castle and bare grass snow mobile runs, we had a wonderful time together.

Our winter beginners' English class ended on February 27 with around three dozen people participating, almost evenly split between "beginning beginners" and those with a little English already. We read Psalm 23 together at the start of every class. Each week I would look in depth at one line of the Psalm and talk about our Christian faith. The very last night we learned the word "amen" — the only non-English word in our prayer. Each class also ends with prayer for the week and an invitation to study and worship.




Mission Moment

"Sir, respect. I would like to learn about Christianity." This was a text I received this month from an unknown number. "What is your name?" usually my standard response to this kind of text. The name was one I knew: a student from my beginners' English class. He has very, very limited English. But enough to use Google translate to ask more about our faith.

People often ask me how "big" our congregation is. That implies there is a set number of people that are "in," that are "Christian," as opposed to those who are not. I prefer to think in terms of people being drawn closer to Christ...and those the world is trying to pull away.

Whether it is someone who sits in the pew every Sunday, or someone just asking about Christianity, God is at work through the Gospel of Jesus to call people to his Son. Through the Good News, we pray that we are all being brought closer to Christ each day.
