On our way from the cemetery the car phone rang. It was another 90-year-old member who had not yet allowed me to visit in person. She was ready to end her life, and at last wanted to see me face to face.

Deb and I made our way across Montreal to her. A family member was there, another member who had not attended worship in well over a decade. I sat with them and shared the Good News of Jesus, who while we were still enemies saved us and gave us "the right to be called children of God." (Romans 5:6-10, 1 John 1:12). Both these dear lambs of God had starved themselves of the Word of God, and needed desperately to start drinking "pure spiritual milk" again (1 Peter 2:2-3).

The family member was pleased to see me in person. They had heard over the internet the words I shared at their aunt's funeral, which they had been unable to attend. They're now is thinking seriously about coming back to worship to receive Christ's strengthening gifts.

Every chance to proclaim the Faith opens doors into people's hearts. The Lord asks us to trust him that his "word will not return empty" (Isaiah 55:11).
